Transitional Respite

People who live with an intellectual disability who are currently living in their family home, or who are supported by an organization receiving community home based supports, will be provided with the experience and skills needed to live as independently as possible.



This real-life experience will be provided in a local community

apartment setting which participants are encouraged to treat as their own place.

- Participants are introduced to an apartment living situation away from their family home in a safe manner, allowing them to explore future possibilities.
- Participants identify their own goals and aspirations with the support of a Coordinator.
- The Coordinator-through close observation-teaches and facilitates all activities the person will need to live independently.
- At the end of their learning experience, participants and their families will have an objective report from the Coordinator to identify what supports they will need to have in place to be safe and successful while living independently.
- Participants and their families will work with the Coordinator to develop an experiential stay schedule that meets the participant's needs and provides optimal learning.

This support model maximizes the benefits of services purchased through Passport funding.
